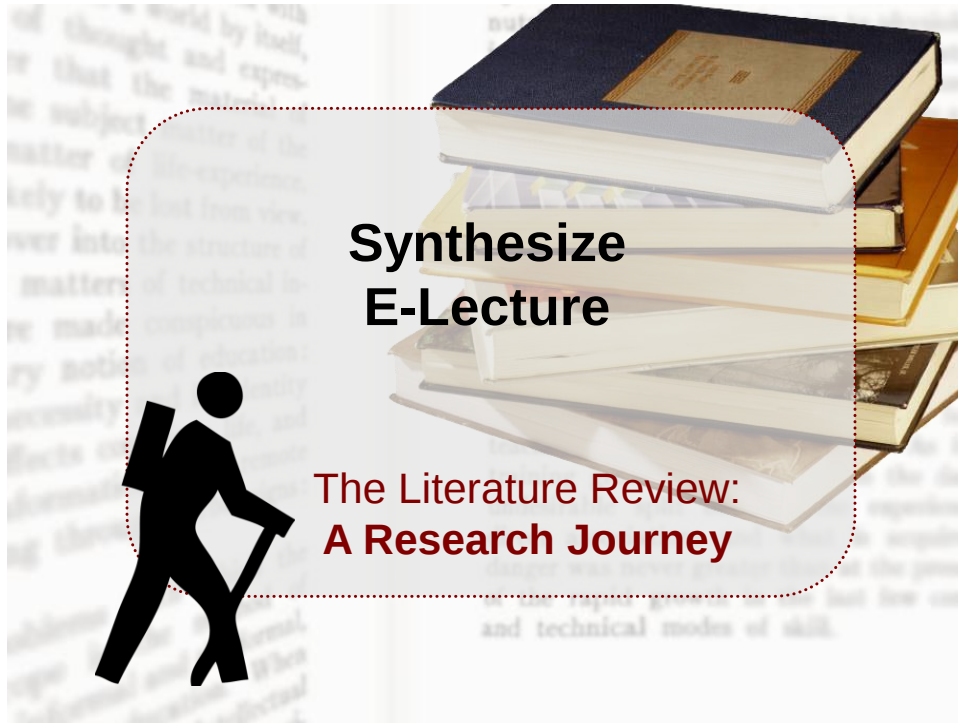

- Synthesize: compare & contrast, critically evaluate, interpret, draw conclusions

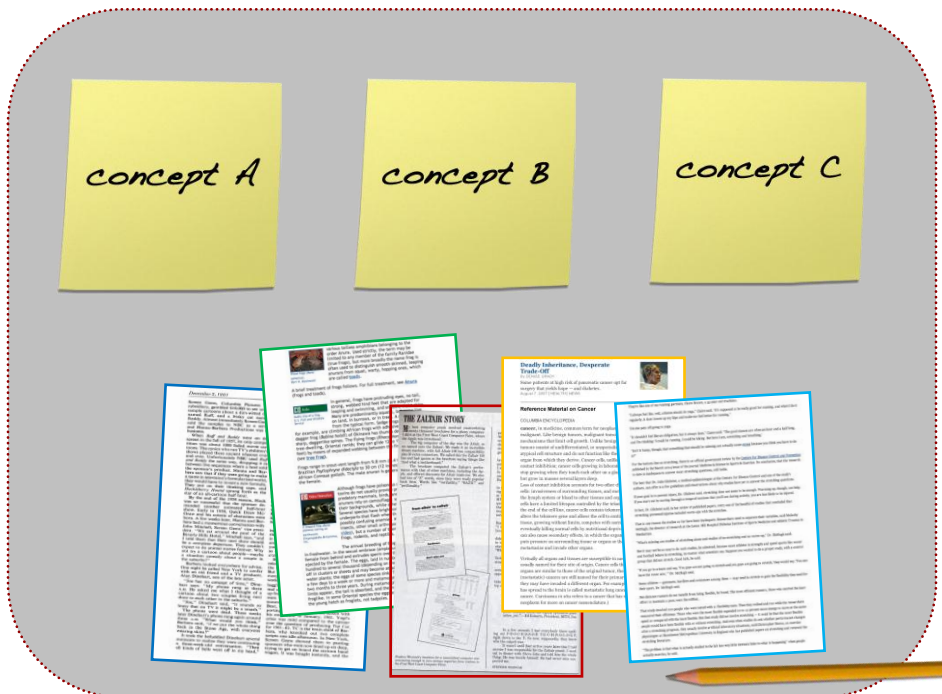

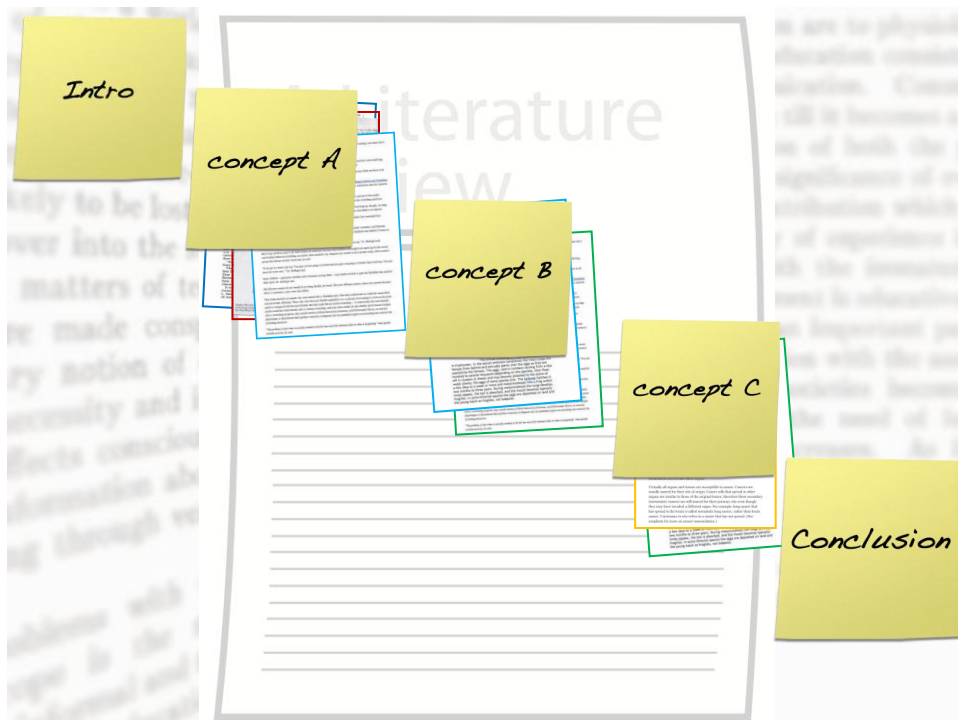
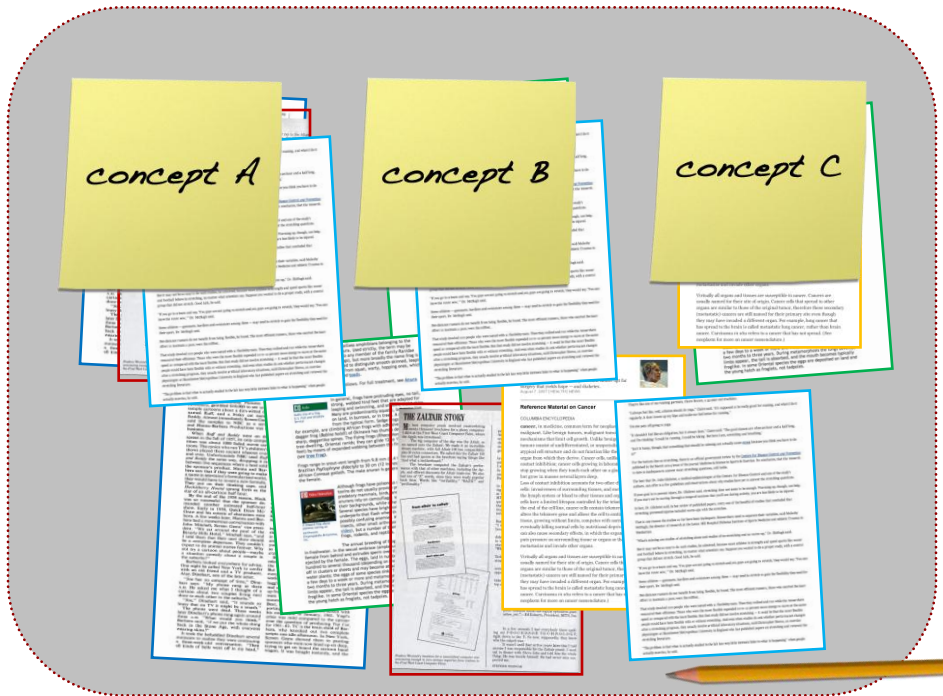
What's Involved in Synthesizing?
